Australian Computer Society (ACS) – Governance

Dereliction of duty and the urgent need for reform

We believe that the Management Committee of the Australian Computer Society (ACS) has failed in its responsibility to the Society's members:

- to ensure the Society conducts its affairs in a fit and proper manner.
- to act transparently and to respond to reasonable questions from Members.

In addition, over the past seven years, the Management Committee has presided over:

- a decline in voting members by more than half.
- a decline in professional members by two-thirds.
- a diversion from its primary activity of enhancing the profession to one of assessing the skills of potential immigrants on behalf of the Federal Government.
- a further diversification into commercial activities of no direct relevance to Members.

The failure to ensure the Society conducts its affairs in a fit and proper manner is in itself ample reason for the members of the Management Committee to resign, or justification for the Congress to dismiss them, allowing the election of replacements.

The implications of the court's findings must also be taken into account. In October 2019 a Special General Meeting was convened to vote on a special resolution proposed by the Management Committee to restructure the ACS from an incorporated association to a Company Limited by Guarantee. The restructuring proposal was passed by a single vote.

This outcome was challenged in the Federal Court, citing voting irregularities and a failure to properly inform Members of the vote. In the Federal Court, Justice Michael Wigney declared that the meeting and the special resolution were invalid. He issued a scathing assessment of the Management Committee's handling of the meeting and ACS was ordered to pay costs. In light of the failure of the Management Committee to properly discharge its responsibility to ensure acceptable governance of the affairs of the Society, we call upon Congress:

- to dismiss the members of the Management Committee who have been responsible for the plight that the Society is now in.
- to elect replacement members of the Management Committee who are committed to reviving appropriate governance of our professional society.
